Motor Trolling Permitted
Northern Pike: Minimum Size 32", Daily Bag 1
Hook & Line Open Year-Round (except Musky, Sturgeon, Trout, Paddlefish, and Threatened and Endangered Species.
Note: Regulations differ on the Fox River

Native Plant Stands
Do not motor through or anchor in stands of native plants
They are important for fish habitat and erosion control

- Lighted Channel Marker Buoy
- Channel Marker Buoy
- No Wake Zone
- Caution: Water Hazard
- Invasive Plant Colony (Confirmed)

Aquatic Invasive Species NOTICE:
Eurasian Water Milfoil and Curly Leaf Pondweed have been identified in Lake Puckaway.
Avoid Spreading these Invasive Plants around the lake. Do not motor through vegetation
Remove all plants from your boat and motor before leaving the immediate area
Thoroughly Check your boat and trailer before launching boat or leaving the lake
