Lauree Renaud updated the committee on a grant application for the design and construction of the multiuse path from Green Lake to Ripon. The DNR grant being applied for is for \$200,000 matching grant. The match has been pledged by a family in Ripon.

IZAAK WALTON LEAGUE GIFT OF PROPERTY TO GREEN LAKE COUNTY

Meulemans is working on the deeds to transfer the property. She is working with Mike Lehner and will have the deeds done before she leaves. Meulemans suggested that the new Corporation Counsel complete the property transfer when the person takes office. The Izaak Walton League would like to see this competed by the end of the year.

EASEMENT MANCHESTER PROPERTY

Dean Miller is requesting an easement on the south side of the Manchester Highway Shop property. There is an easement there that the Fridays have that they bought years ago. Meulemans stated that this has been discussed at a Highway Committee meeting with all three property owners. Miller explained that the right of way would enhance the use of the commercial property. Fridays does not want their right of way use by others. Highway Committee acted to deny permission to the Millers to use the right of way and did not

want any formal change to the land documents. Dean Miller stated that the land is land locked because the other easement is to his brother's house, not to his property. The Highway Committee stated that the use is to be used only to traverse to the property, not to be used by the public. Discussion was held. No action was taken.
