Letter from Tony Barthuly, Administrator, Division of Law Enforcement Services State Department of Justice thanking us for our efforts and continued partnership in making Wisconsin a safer place by collecting DNA samples from offenders. There has been a 205% increase in the number of offender samples received by the DNA Databank since 2014. In 2016 a total of 904 investigative leads were reported out due to the use of the Databank. This exceeds the highest number of annual leads by 212 leads. Included with the letter was a check for \$1870.00 for our participation in the program.

He and the Sheriff reported on the recent meeting with the National Weather Service – Sullivan. They felt they were privileged to be invited as we are such a small County. To Judicial and Law Enforcement Committee Members,


We are happy to report that the 2017 deer gun season has closed without major incident. We did respond to a duck hunter whose boat had capsized in the Grand River Marsh about 25 minutes from the landing on CTH B. He had on chest waders and the water was waist deep, other than being cold he was alright and rescued safely.

There were only 33 reported car deer accidents this November in comparison to 49 last November. So far we have not had any weather related accidents, though with this week's forecast for snow that could change.

The building wide Active Shooter Drill was held today. Though everything went well, there were things learned and changes will be made to better prepare us in the event of a real scenario.

RE: Holds Reimbursement for State Fiscal Year 2017

Dear Sheriff Podoll:

This letter is to advise you that the Green lake County Treasurer will be receiving reimbursement pursuant to s.302.33(2)(a)3, Wisconsin Statutes, for felony probationers, parolees, and persons on extended supervision who were held in your jail because of conduct which violated their supervision and did not constitute new criminal behavior. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, the Department has \$4,885,700 in this appropriation.

Section 302.33(2)(a)3 of the Wisconsin Statutes provides that the Department shall reimburse the county at a rate of \$40.00 per person per day, unless the claims exceed the amount of funds available. In that circumstance the Department, by statute, must prorate the payment. For the fiscal year 2016-2017, counties submitted claims totaling 141,905 days. This number of bed days results in a per diem rate of \$34.42 for the reporting fiscal year. Based on the outstanding partnership between the Department and Green lake County, DOC will be able to cover the remaining balance of \$5.58 to provide \$40.00 per person per day to the County. However, we note that these additional funds may not be available in future years.

Green lake County will be receiving funds in the amount of \$31,240.00 for 781 billable days for the period of July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017.

Additionally the Department of Corrections continues the Short Term Sanctions Program. Over \$9,085,389.19 was paid to counties during the July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, time period for housing violators in this program. These payments are separate from, and in addition to, the reimbursable payable holds.

The Department continues to greatly value the professional working relationships that exist among County Sheriff Departments and the Department of Corrections staff throughout the state. We know that jail beds are a limited resource and that counties are facing budget constraints. Our partnership continues to be critical to protecting public safety and maintaining safe communities.
