This letter serves as notice that your contract is being canceled per your contract Clause #2 CANCELLATION, due to nonappropriation of funds. As the effective date of cancelation is September 23, 2017; you will not be paid for any work performed after that date. Your payment for September will be prorated to 73% of the month, example: if you are normally paid \$1,000/month this month you will only be paid \$730.00. Attached is a chart for reference. Please submit your invoices by September 29, 2017.

Hello Law/Judicial Committee Members -

As you may be aware, GLSO and Highway receive numerous complaints yearly concerning deer carcasses littering our roadway edges. While not a law enforcement issue, we take some of the heat publically for the failure of the current, now eliminated, carcass abatement process. The public doesn't care about city, county, state, or town roads and who's responsible, they care that a 150 animal carcass is rotting in 80 degree heat right in front of them or their residence. Anyway, I received the attached e-mail from Amy at Highway. The e-mail announces the cancellation of the existing (former) state contracts with vendors who were supposed to recover or abate deer carcasses. GLSO and Highway worked together to try and make that failed system function as best as we could.

Controlled fire is used to wipe out overgrowth, waste, and dead material. That fire also releases new seed and affords room for growth and change. Hopefully, the elimination of funding for the car kill deer (CKD) program is the controlled fired need to effect change in how our CKD process is managed. Watch closely for new ideas and direction from both the DOT and local governments in how this is managed. You might have an idea that has merit. The point of contact for the DOT is in the letter. I suspect that local governments will bear more of the burden, however, I'm hoping for positive change.

I want to recognize Cassie Kohn for walking a caller though CPR over the phone that surely made the difference in the survival of the patient (case 172511) last night (9/12/17). While the patient wasn't revived until officers and EMS arrived, I don't believe the revival would have been possible without Cassie helping the caller through CPR while help was on the way. ALS had a slower response time due to being on a training exercise on Orchard Ave, rather than responding from the Green Lake station. The residence was on Spaulding Hill Rd. EMS personnel would be more qualified than me to analyze how the rescue was achieved, but I believe the circulation provided by CPR until advance life support arrived made the revival possible. Without it, I think there likely would have been a different outcome.

To Judicial and Law Enforcement Committee Members.

Code Red was utilized twice since our last meeting. Both times were on September 23. The first started as an eluding case in Berlin and ended in Princeton with the use of stop sticks. The driver fled on foot and was apprehended after an extensive search. He was charged with Recklessly Endangering Safety, Fleeing, Eluding, Operating without the Owners Consent, Resisting and Bail Jumping.

Later that day, the Green Lake County E911 Communications Center received a call concerning a weapons related incident where a man fled into an apartment with a firearm in the City of Green Lake. Law Enforcement arrived and determined that all other occupants had fled the building. The CTU team as called out, a command post was established, equipment was summoned and efforts began to reach out to the male party to establish communications. The male party appeared from the upper apartment and had serious self-inflicted, life threatening, injuries. Flight for Life was summoned and transported him to Theda Clark Hospital. The investigation continues with criminal charges expected to be referred to the District Attorney within the coming weeks.

We have applied for the BOTS Seat Belt Grant or 2018 and anticipate receiving \$10,000 of wage and fringe money to assist in Task Force Deployments starting in March 2018 through September, 2018.
