Amending Chapter 103. Animals

4 Section 1. Article IV, Animals; Humane Officers is created as follows:

5 §103-50. Definitions.

6 As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

7

8 **DEPARTMENT**

9 The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection.

10 **HUMANE OFFICER**

11 A person appointed under §173.03, Wis. Stats. to exercise powers or carry out
12 duties identified under §173.07, Wis. Stats.

13 **POLITICAL SUBDIVISION**

14 A city, village, town or county.

15 §103-51. Humane Officer.

16 A. The Green Lake County Board may appoint or terminate one or more humane
17 officers. Upon appointment of one or more humane officers, the County Clerk shall
18 give written notice to the Department within 30 days of the appointment or
19 termination. The notice shall include all of the following:

20 1. That the appointing political subdivision is Green Lake County.

21 2. The name and address of the humane officer.

22 3. The human officer's certification number if the human officer is currently certified
23 under Wisconsin Administrative Code Ch. 15 Humane Officer Training and
24 Certification.

25 4. The date of the appointment or termination.

26 B. A humane officer appointed under this Article shall carry out his or her duties
27 throughout Green Lake County, other than within the boundaries of a city or village
28 whose governing body adopts a resolution withdrawing from county enforcement of
29 human laws and transmits a copy of the resolution to the Green Lake County Clerk.

30 §103-52. Abatement Orders.

31 A. The Judicial Law Enforcement/Emergency Management committee is hereby
32 designated and authorized, pursuant to §173.02(2) Wis. Stats. to affirm, modify, or
33 withdraw abatement orders issued under §173.11 Wis. Stats. by any humane
34 officer or law enforcement officer.

35 B. Content of Abatement Order. An abatement order issued under §173.11 Wis.
36 Stats. shall contain all of the following:

37 1. The name and address of the person to whom the abatement order is directed.

38 2. The statute or ordinance alleged to be violated.

39 3. A prohibition on further violations.

40 4. A description of measures necessary to correct the alleged violation.

41 5. A description of the hearing and appeal provisions under sub (C).

42 C. Appealing an abatement order.

43 1. Any person named in an abatement order may appeal such order to the Judicial
44 Law Enforcement/Emergency Management committee within 10 days of service
45 of the abatement order.

46 2. The notice of appeal must state the grounds for the appeal with specificity.

47 3. The Judicial Law Enforcement/Emergency Management committee shall
48 schedule a hearing to be held within 10 days of the receipt of the notice of
49 appeal, unless the appellant agrees to a later date.

50 4. The Judicial Law Enforcement/Emergency Management committee shall make
51 reasonable efforts to notify the appellant, the officer issuing the abatement
52 order, and any other interested party of the hearing and the opportunity to
53 present evidence and testimony at the hearing.

54 5. The hearing shall be informal in nature.

55 6. Within 10 days after the hearing, the Judicial Law Enforcement/Emergency
56 Management committee shall determine whether to affirm, modify and affirm, or
57 withdraw the abatement order and shall issue its decision in writing and shall
58 serve it upon the appellant and other interested persons.

59 7. Any person adversely affected by a decision under sub (6.) may seek judicial
60 review by commencing an action in circuit court within 30 days after the date of
61 the decision.

62 Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication.

63 Section 3. The repeal and recreation of any section herein shall not have any effect on
64 existing litigation and shall not operate as an abatement of any action or proceeding then
65 pending or by virtue of the repealed sections.

To Judicial and Law Enforcement Committee Members,

A PREA (Prison Rape Elimination Act) complaint against a staff member was investigated and resolved in January. The results, including a recording of the “non-event”, were forwarded to the District Attorney and State Regional Jail Inspector who signed off on the work done. The report made by the inmate was clearly a false report. The Sheriff is considering having charges filed for “Obstructing or File a False Police Report”.

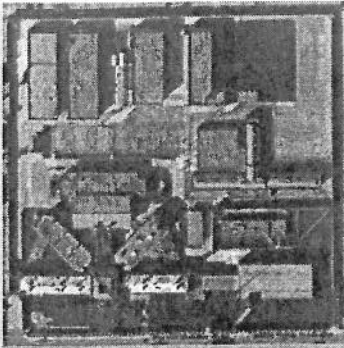
From 2012, the County Correctional Facility is being sued due to an inmate death by hanging – also from 2012. Recently, depositions and discovery ramped up and are taking place in January and February. The County is being represented by Attorney Charles Bohl – hired by Wisconsin County Mutual Insurance. For me to tell you more I would have to go into closed session. The County Administrator and Corporation Counsel are monitoring this case.

The Sheriff assigned the Chief Deputy as supervisor, Det. Holdorf, and Sgt. Kiener (GLSO Use of Force Instructors) to perform an Administrative Policy Review involving the fatal officer involved shooting in Kewaunee County last fall. The Sheriff has the final report that he is reviewing and will meet with the Sheriff of Kewaunee County.

Be safe, especially driving. All of these repeated light snows we are having tend to create poor road conditions.

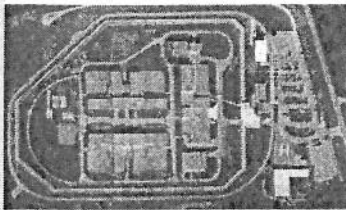

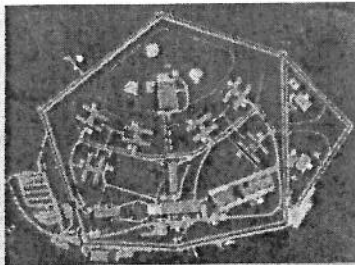

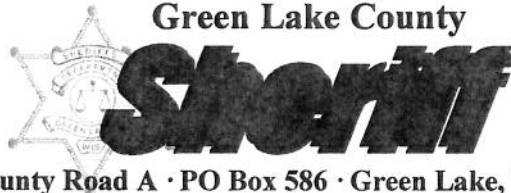
