WHEREAS, Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin has offered to provide a forklift to the Green Lake County Food Panty using Oshkosh Area Community Foundation grant funds in exchange for Green Lake County remaining a Feeding America Easter Wisconsin drop site host; and,

WHEREAS, the donation is contingent on the County executing a Memorandum of Understanding which obligates both parties to perform certain duties. The Memorandum of Understanding is attached to this Resolution; and;

WHEREAS, the forklift donation will assist Green Lake County in efficient operation of its food pantry.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Green Lake County Board of Supervisors hereby accepts the grant funds from the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation to purchase a forklift for the use at the Green Lake County Food Pantry located at 500 Lake Steel Street, Green Lake, WI.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Green Lake County Board of Supervisors authorize County Administrator Catherine J. Schmit to sign the Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of Green Lake County after Corporation Counsel has approved the Memorandum of Understanding as to form.

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THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Health and Human Services
Department shall include in its annual budget sufficient funds to maintain, repair, service
and provide upkeep, and care of the forklift and training for forklift operator(s).



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN:

Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin 1700 W. Fond du Lac Ave Milwaukee, WI 53205 Green Lake County 571 County Road A Green Lake, WI 54941

For a valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is hereby entered into between Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin and Green Lake County.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this MOU is to develop and expand a framework of cooperating between Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin and Green Lake County, which operates a food pantry to develop and continue mutually beneficial programs and projects that work to eliminate hunger.

FEEDING AMERICA EASTERN WISCONSIN SHALL:

- 1. Serve as the fiscal agent for grant funding provided by Oshkosh Area Community Foundation to implement certain infrastructure purchases.
- 2. Purchase a forklift using grant funds provided by Oshkosh Area Community Foundation. Provide to Green Lake County for use in the Green Lake food pantry drop site for Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin member agencies located in Green Lake County.
- 3. Maintain proper records of how the grant funds have been used. These records shall be made available to Oshkosh Area Community Foundation at reasonable times for review and/or audit.
- 4. Comply with all reasonable requests made by Oshkosh Area Community Foundation for information regarding the use of grant funds.

GREEN LAKE COUNTY SHALL:

- 1. Remain a Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin drop site host and utilize the provided forklift to improve efficiency of the drop site. Green Lake County will reasonably work to encourage food pantries in Green Lake County to utilize Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin in connection with the drop site.
- 2. Will not sell, lease and/or lose possession of the forklift within in five (5) years of asset purchase without written notification and approval of Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin.
- 3. Properly insure the provided forklift in compliance with mandatory insurance laws of the State of Wisconsin and maintain such insurance on the provided forklift while in operation. Green Lake County shall hold Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin harmless for these insurance expenses.
- 4. Be solely responsible for all maintenance, repair, service, upkeep, and care of the provided forklift and shall hold Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin harmless for such expenses.

- 5. Be solely responsible for any additional fees for licensing, and/or taxes on the provided forklift throughout its operational use by Green Lake County. Green Lake County shall hold Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin harmless for such expenses.
- 6. Green Lake County shall hold Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin harmless for any accident, injury, or personal liability due to use of the forklift.
- 7. Require any personnel who operating the provided forklift to possess a valid operation certification and provide the certification to Green Lake County prior to operation of said forklift.
- 8. Require any personnel who operate the provided forklift to obey by all safe operation standards including, but not limited to, wearing safety constraints, refraining from operating the forklift under the influence of drugs or alcohol, and reporting any accidents to the proper authorities.
- 9. Provide Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin reasonable assistance in relation to requests for information, publicity, and other efforts as they relate to the purchase and use of the forklift contemplated in this MOU.

PRINCIPLE CONTACTS FOR PARTNERSHIP

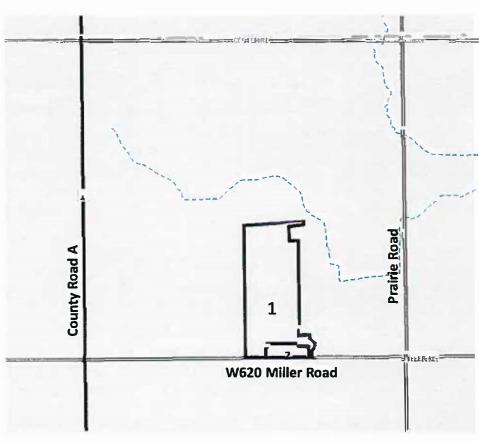

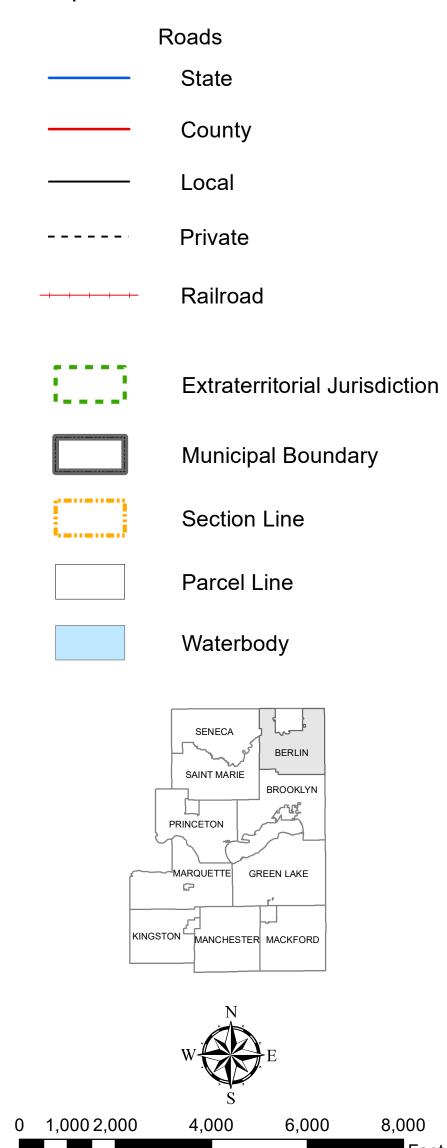

Budgetary Adjustment Explanation

The Computer Forensic Account was created as a protected account. When it was first established the deposits were being deposited directly into the Carryover Account. The auditors recommended that deposits not go into this account but rather a new account be created under the revenues.

In 2016 and 2017 funds were deposited into this account but were never transferred over into the carryover account.

The revenue for the Computer Forensic Examiner program comes from annual contributions from the five law enforcement agencies, donations from people who have been assisted by officers after being locked out of their vehicles, and any other donations made from community organizations. Donors are expressly informed that their donations will support the Computer Forensic Examiner program. The program and procedure for forwarding lockout donations to the program were developed during a chiefs' meeting with everyone in agreement. The DA's office had agreed to keep the account under our budget as we are a neutral party, so to speak. The account was to be protected, and it was never intended for any unspent funds to be transferred to the general fund of the county.

After the previous officer acting as Computer Forensic Examiner resigned in December 2015, there was no officer assigned to that role. From 2016 until 2018 the contributions from the law enforcement agencies ceased but the donations from lockouts continued. At the chiefs' meeting it was discussed and the understanding was that these donations would continue, from all of the agencies, to increase the account balance.

The total amount that should have been carried over is \$350.00 in the year 2017 and \$370.00 in the year 2016.
