

#### **Report of Committee Action**

February 18, 2020

**Regarding:** Scott O. Sommers Rezone Request, N2992 County Road B H, Parcel #014-00767-0000, Part of the SW1/4 of Section 30, T15N, R12E, ±40 acres, Town of Marquette.

**Request:** Rezone ±3.9 acres from A-1 Farmland Preservation District to R-4 Rural Residential District

Dear County Board Supervisors;

In instances where the Land Use Planning & Zoning Committee chooses to recommend the denial of a rezone petition, Section 59.69(5)(e)4, Wis. Stats. requires the Land Use Planning & Zoning Committee to report its reasoning for the action directly to the County Board.

**Reasoning for denial action:** Section 91.48(1), Wis. Stats., "Farmland Preservation" states that land may only be rezoned out of a farmland preservation zoning district, without having the rezoning certified under Section 91.36, if the political subdivision (County) finds all of the following, after public hearing:

- (a) The land is better suited for use not allowed in the farmland preservation district.
- (b) The rezoning is consistent with any applicable comprehensive plan.
- (c) The rezoning is substantially consistent with the county certified farmland preservation plan.
- (d) The rezoning will not substantially impair or limit current or future agricultural use of the surrounding parcels of land that are zoned for or are legally restricted to agricultural use.

The Committee determined that the rezone petition could not meet criterion (a) above. The property, although developed with a single-family dwelling and several agricultural outbuildings, had been used agriculturally for over 100 years. The soils underlying the site are a Kidder loam, which is a productive soil for the County. The slopes of the property are 0 to 6% so there is only a slight chance for erosion of topsoil from stormwater runoff. Further, the Committee looked at the property owner's proposed use of the to-be-rezoned parcel. The owner had explained that he had hoped to market the property as a farmette. A farmette use is a use that is allowed in the Farmland Preservation District.

Additionally, the rezone petition, if approved, would remove ±3.9 acres from the Farmland Preservation District. Removing acreage from the Farmland Preservation District is not in the best interests of the Farmland Preservation Plan Farmland preservation ordinances, as detailed above, and thus not in the best interest of the citizens of the County. Especially, considering that the parcel of land could be resized

to include 8 acres (less right-of-way) and avoid any rezone or depletion of Farmland Preservation zoned lands. The additional acreage would better lend itself to agricultural uses that any prospective buyer might be interested in or these lands could be rented out.

The Committee felt that the petition could meet criteria (b) through (d), but all four criteria must be met to allow for the rezone. So the Committee felt it had no choice but to recommend denial.

Section 59.69(5)(e)5, Wis. Stats., states that upon receipt of the report the County Board may disregard the Committee's recommendation and enact the ordinance as drafted by the Committee (See Note below), it may accept the Committee's recommendation and deny the petition for the rezone, or the County Board may refuse to deny the petition as recommended by the Committee. In this case the County Board shall rerefer the petition for rezone to the Committee with direction to draft an ordinance to effectuate the petition and report the ordinance back to the board, who may enact or reject the ordinance.

Note: As discussed in this report, the rezone does not meet all of the statutory and zoning ordinance criteria to be rezoned out of the Farmland Preservation District. A recent discussion with DATCP, regarding the County Board approving a rezone that is in conflict with Statutes, informed Planning & Zoning staff that DATCP's certification of County's Farmland Preservation Plan and Farmland Preservation Ordinance could be revoked. Decertification of these plan would eliminate Farmland Preservation credits for all Green Lake County property owners who take part in this program.

In many cases a rezone petition represents a property owner's hopes and dreams. It is unfortunate that, in this case, the Land Use Planning & Zoning Committee cannot recommend approval. Had these lands been steeply sloped and wooded, had the soils been unproductive, had there been wetlands or other water resources nearby, this Committee might have seen the petition differently. In absence of these characteristics, the Committee requests the County Board deny this rezone petition.
