Amending Alcohol Violations, Chapter 163, Article I and Chapter 15, Citations.

The County Board of Supervisors of Green Lake County, Green Lake Wisconsin, duly assembled at its regular meeting begun on the 15th day of September 2020, does ordain as follows:

- 1 **WHEREAS**, Wisconsin Statute §125.10(2) allows a county to enact an ordinance
- 2 regulated by §125.07(1) or (4)(a), (b) or (bm) if it strictly conforms to the statutory
- 3 subsection; and,

WHEREAS, 2017 WI Act 126 was passed to close a “loophole” in the “social host” statute and county ordinances after case law interpreted “premises” to mean a licensed establishment rather than a private residence, thereby making the “social host” ordinances unenforceable against adults who allow underage alcohol parties on their private property; and,

4 **WHEREAS**, Green Lake County has adopted an ordinance under §125.10(2); however
5 after the passage of 2017 WI Act 126, the County ordinance no longer is in strict
6 conformity with the §125.07(1) and requires an amendment to conform to current statute.

7 **NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY**
8 **OF GREEN LAKE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

9 Section 1. Green Lake County Ordinance, No. 582-95, adopted 6-20-1995 and as
10 periodically amended (additions in underline, deletions in ~~strikeout~~) is hereby amended as
11 follows:

12 §163-1 Definitions.

13

14 **BREWER**

15 Any person who manufactures fermented malt beverages for sale or
16 transportation, except that “brewer” does not include a permittee under Wis. Stat.
17 §125.295

18

19 **JUVENILE**

20 a person who has not attained 17 years of age.

21

22 **LICENSE**

23 An authorization to sell alcohol beverages issued by a municipal city, town or
24 village governing body.

25

26 **PERSON**

27 A natural person, sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company,
28 corporation or association or the owner of a single-owner entity that is disregarded as a
29 separate entity under Wis. Ch. 71.

30

31 **WHOLESALE**

32 A person, other than a brewer, brew pub, manufacturer or rectifier, who sells
33 alcohol beverages to a licensed retailer or to another person who holds a permit or license
34 to sell alcohol beverages at wholesale.

35

36 §163-2 General violations.

37

38 A. No person adult 21 years of age or older may procure for, sell, dispense or give away
39 any alcohol beverages to any underage person not accompanied by his or her parent,
40 guardian or spouse who has attained the legal drinking age.

41
42 B. No adult ~~21 years of age or older~~ may knowingly permit or fail to take action to prevent
43 the illegal consumption of alcohol beverages by an underage person on property,
44 including any premises owned and occupied by the adult or occupied by the adult and
45 under the adult's control. This subdivision applies at a lodging establishment, as
46 defined in Wis. Stat. §106.52(1)(d), only if the adult has furnished payment or security
47 for lodging. This subsection does not apply to alcohol beverages used exclusively as
48 part of a religious service.

49
50 C. No licensee or permittee ~~21 years of age or older~~ may sell, vend, deal or traffic in
51 alcohol beverage to or with any underage person not accompanied by his or her
52 parent, guardian or spouse who has attained the legal drinking age.

53
54 D. No adult may intentionally encourage or contribute to a violation of §163-3.

55
56 § 163-3. Violations by underage persons.

57
58 A. Any underage person who does any of the following is guilty of a violation:

59
60 (1) Possesses or consumes alcohol beverages on a licensed premises, unless
61 accompanied by a parent, guardian or spouse who has attained the legal drinking
62 age.

63
64 (2) Procures or attempts to procure alcohol beverages from a licensee or permittee.

65
66 (3) Falsely represents his or her age for the purpose of receiving alcohol beverages
67 from a licensee or permittee.

68
69 (4) Enters, knowingly attempts to enter or is on a licensed premises in violation of Wis.
70 Stat. 125.07(3)(a).

71
72 (5) Except as provided in paragraph B. below, any underage person not accompanied
73 by his or her parent, guardian or spouse who has attained the legal drinking age
74 who knowingly possesses or or consumes alcohol beverages.

75
76 B. An underage person may possess alcohol beverages in the course of employment
77 during his or her working hours if employed by any of the following:

78
79 (1) A brewer or brew pub.

80
81 (2) A fermented malt beverages wholesaler.

82
83 (3) A permittee other than a Class "B" or "Class B" permittee.

84
85 (4) A facility for the production of alcohol fuel.

86

87 (5) A retail licensee or permittee under the conditions specified in § 125.32(2) or
88 125.68(2), Wis. Stats., or for delivery of unopened containers to the home or
89 vehicle of a customer.

90
91 (6) Campus, if the underage person is at least 18 years of age and is under the
92 immediate supervision of a person who has attained the legal drinking age.

93
94 § 163-4. Violations and penalties – General Violations.

95
96 A. Any ~~adult who is 21 years of age or older~~ person who commits a violation of § 163-2 of
97 this article is subject to a forfeiture of:

98
99 (1) Not less than \$25 nor more than \$500 if the person has not committed a previous
100 violation within ~~12~~ 30 months of the violation.

101
102 (2) Not less than \$200 nor more than \$500 if the person has committed a previous
103 violation within ~~12~~ 30 months of the violation.

104
105 (3) Not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or imprisoned for not mor than 90 days or
106 both if the person has committed two previous violations within ~~12~~ 30 months of the
107 violation.

108
109 (4) Not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$~~5~~ 10,000 or imprisoned for not more than 9
110 months or both if the person has committed three or more previous violations with
111 ~~12~~ 30 months of the violation.

112
113 B. Further, a court shall suspend any license or permit issued under Ch. 125, Wis. Stats.,
114 to a person for:

115
116 (1) Not more than three days, if the court finds that the person committed a violation
117 within 12 months after committing one previous violation.

118
119 (2) Not less than three days nor more than 10 days, if the court finds that the person
120 committed a violation within 12 months after committing two other violations.

121
122 (3) Not less than 15 days nor more than 30 days, if the court finds that the person
123 committed the violation within 12 months after committing three other violations.

124
125 C. For purposes of determining previous violations under this article, the ~~twelve~~ 30-month
126 period shall be measured from the dates of violations that resulted in an imposition of a
127 forfeiture or a conviction. For purposes of determining whether or not a previous
128 violation has occurred if more than one violation occurs at the same time, all those
129 violations shall be counted as one violation.

130 § 163-5. Penalties for underage persons.

131
132 A. Any person who violates ~~§ 163-2 or~~ 163-3 A (1)-(4) of this article ~~who has not attained~~
133 ~~the legal drinking age~~ is subject to the following:

134
135 (1) For the first violation, either a forfeiture of not less than ~~\$10 nor more than~~
136 ~~\$300~~\$250 nor more than \$500, suspension of the person's operating privileges as
137 provided for under Wis. Stat. §343.30(60)(b)1., ~~for 30 to 90 days, participation in a~~
138 ~~supervised work program or other~~ community service work, ~~alcohol assessment or~~
139 ~~counseling, professional physical or mental health evaluation and assessment, an~~
140 ~~educational, safety or treatment program, or any combination of these penalties in~~
141 ~~addition to any other appropriate penalty not in conflict with state law or any~~
142 ~~combination of these penalties.~~

144 (2) For a violation committed within 12 months of a previous violation, either a forfeiture
145 of not less than ~~\$25-300~~ nor more than \$500, participation in a supervised work
146 program or othe community service work or any combination of these penalties. In
147 addition, the person's operating privilege may be suspended as provided under Wis.
148 Stat. §343.30(6)9b)2, except if the violation involved a motor vehicle the person's
149 operating privilege shall be suspended as provided under Wis. Stat.
150 §343.30(6)(b)2.~~the suspension of the person's operating privileges for not more~~
151 ~~than one year, community service, alcohol assessment or counseling, professional~~

160 provided under Wis. Stat. §343.30(60)(b)3., except that if the violation involved a
161 motor vehicle the person's operating privilege shall be suspended as provided
162 under §343.30(6)(b)3.~~revocation of the person's operating privileges for not more~~
163 ~~than two years, community service, alcohol assessment or counseling, professional~~
164 ~~physical or mental health evaluation and assessment, an educational, safety or~~

168 (4) For a violation committed within 12 months of three or more previous violations,

172 provided under Wis. Stat. §343.30(6)(b)3.

174 B. Any person who violates §163-3 A(5) of this article is subject to the following penalties:

176 (1) For a first violation, a forfeiture of not less than \$100 nor more than \$200,
177 suspension of the person's operating privilege as provided under Wis. Stat.
178 §343.30(6)(b)1., participation in a supervised work program or other community
179 service work or any combination of these penalties.

181 (2) For a violation committed within 12 months of one previous violation, either a
182 forfeiture of not less than \$200 nor more than \$300, participation in a supervised
183 work program or other community service work or any combination of these
184 penalties. In addition, the person's operating privilege may be suspended as
185 provided under Wis. Stat. §343.30(6)(b)2., except that if the violation involved a
186 motor vehicle the person's operating privilege shall be suspended as provided
187 under Wis. Stat. §343.30(6)(b)2.

189 (3)For a violation committed within 12 months of 2 previous violations, either a
190 forfeiture of not less than \$300 nor more than \$500, participation in a supervised
191 work program or other community service work or any combination of these
192 penalties. In addition, the person's operating privilege may be suspended as
193 provided under Wis. Stat. §343.30(6)(b)3., except that if the violation involved a
194 motor vehicle the person's operating privilege shall be suspended as provided
195 under Wis. Stat. §343.30(6)(b)3.

197 (4) For a violation committed within 12 months of 3 or more previous violations, either a
198 forfeiture of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000, participation in a supervised
199 work program or other community service work or any combination of these
200 penalties. In addition, the person's operating privilege may be suspended as
201 provided under Wis. Stat. §343.30(6)(b)3., except that if the violation involved a
202 motor vehicle the person's operating privilege shall be suspended as provided
203 under Wis. Stat. §343.30(6)(b)3.

205 C. Any juvenile who violates §163-3 of this article is subject to the penalties found in Wis.
206 Stat. §938.344(2) and (2b).

208 D.B. For purposes of determining previous violations under this article, the twelve-month
209 period shall be measured from the dates of violations that resulted in an imposition of a
210 forfeiture or a conviction. For the purpose of determining whether or not a previous
211 violation has occurred if more than one violation occurs at the same time, all those
212 violations shall be counted as one violation.

213 Section 2. Green Lake County Ordinance, No. 220-80, adopted on 4/15/1980 and as
 214 periodically amended, Chapter 15 – Citations, §15-2 A. (additions in underline, deletions in

After both of our conferences have been cancelled for this year, we are all looking forward to the Clerk of Circuit Court Institute in February with fingers crossed that this will proceed as scheduled.

At this time, the Court is planning to resume in-person court hearings commencing August 10th, including jury trials. Judge Slate has been instrumental in preparing the courtrooms for in-person hearings and I will be working with the court on preparing for a jury trial to ensure the safety of everyone involved.
