<u>YASI</u>: Sleezer reported in 2021 we had a significant increase in referrals. To date since implementing YASI, 43 pre-screens and 15 full assessments and 11 reassessments. Discussion Followed

Coordinated Services Teams: Eichstedt stated she currently has 15 teams. Discussion Followed.

<u>Children's Community Options Program:</u> Peter reported CCOP we have spent the majority of CCOP funding. Discussion Followed.

<u>Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) Update:</u> Meyer reported there are currently 36 Consumers enrolled in CCS 17 of them are children. Meyer reported the customer satisfaction surveys are coming back and are families and clients are highly satisfied on the CCS program at Green Lake County. Discussion Followed.

<u>CLTS (Children's Long Term Support) Program:</u> Meyer reported there are currently 45 consumers enrolled in CLTS with 3-4 kids coming in the next couple weeks. Meyer reported we have 1 full time CLTS Case worker and 4 part time case workers. CLTS state review is currently occurring. Discussion Followed.
