

Partisan Primary – Party Preference

Regarding a Partisan Primary on the Edge / ICX touchscreens, the tabulator will first display a “Party Preference” contest to the voter, upon which all political parties having gained ballot status will appear. (Independent Candidates will NOT appear in the Partisan Primary; they’ll advance directly to the General Election.)

Once a party is selected, only contests/candidates of that political party will appear on the touchscreen. Individual candidates MUST BE SELECTED to receive a vote. NOTE—*It is not possible to “cross-vote” on an Edge or ICX.*

When viewing an Insight / ICE Partisan Primary ballot (as well as a hand-count paper ballot for ICX users), the “Party Preference” section will be presented as the first “voteable” contest on the ballot. Special Instructions precede this section and should be carefully followed.

Rule #1: You may vote in only ONE party’s primary.

Rule #2: If you choose a party, ONLY contests/candidates in THAT party will be counted. Selecting a party “trumps” other parties. If you insert a ballot into the tabulator with a party marked, votes cast for candidates in that party will be tabulated; votes cast in any other party will be ignored.

Rule #3: If you leave the Party Preference contest blank and vote for candidates IN ONLY ONE PARTY, your ballot will be accepted and votes will be counted for those candidates.

However, if you leave the Party Preference contest blank and vote for candidates IN MORE THAN ONE PARTY, your ballot will be rejected and a “Cross Voted Ballot” message will appear. That ballot should be removed from the tabulator and corrected (re-made).

Although we NEVER recommend overriding a Cross Voted Ballot message, if you do accept the ballot as is, NO VOTES WILL BE COUNTED.

Notice to voters: if you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by two (2) election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials (see end of ballot for initials).
