May 2023 Green Lake County Library Reports

Berlin – Happy post-National Library Week. The last two weeks our 120th Anniversary and National Library Week were recognized where we welcomed the community to celebrate with us. Thank you to those who came to celebrate with us.

Now we will soon be welcoming classrooms, daycares, and a few homeschool groups to tour the library. Many classes are walking to the library, so keep your fingers crossed that Spring finally gets here to stay with some nicer walking weather. Our Youth Librarian, Sam, will be going to the Berlin schools to promote the upcoming Summer Reading Program, *All Together Now*. Sam and Dani (Adult Librarian) are putting together some great programs for all ages. So far, it looks like a very exciting summer ahead.

Our newspaper digitization project continues to be a work in progress. We are seeking community funding, with donations so far from the Berlin Historical Society, Friends of the Library, and a few individual donations. I am working on some grants to help supplement the cost.

Scheduled for May are the following programs:

The 5th Annual Plant Swap will take place from May 8-13. Each year we see a variety of plants come in and more, and more joining the swap. There are lots of green thumb participants who look forward to the event.

On May 11, a free CPR class will be offered, with an option to be certified for a fee.

Back by popular demand, we will be hosting Digitizing Services of transferring VHS movies to DVD. This is a free service, but we charge a nominal fee for the discs and flash drives, as they are needed.

On May 16, a Fairy Garden program is being offered. This started out being offered as a kid's program, however, several adults have expressed interest, so we are opening it up to all ages. Who knew fairies would be so popular?!

Puzzle enthusiasts can sign up for a Speed Puzzling Tournament on Saturday, May 20. If you like puzzles, consider putting a team together and joining us!

Green Lake Caestecker – We are fast heading into summer and checking off projects before the rush begins! Summer programming is taking shape and we have an awesome lineup of presenters, activities, and community involvement opportunities all on the theme of *All Together Now*.

One of the projects we're making good progress on is an interior update of the sitting area by the fireplace. With excellent leadership and input from the team over at The Collection in downtown Green Lake we have selected new seating, side tables, standing and table lamps, along with a custom coffee table by local craftsman Ben Rowley and artwork by KDR Wood Design Co. Our library board is also up to full strength again, Mike Puglisi has been appointed as a Town of Brooklyn representative and I am excited to have him as part of the team!

The month of May also brings new displays and program updates:

 we will highlight a selected cookbook. Members each prepare one recipe from the selected cookbook

At the April 3rd meeting, the library board passed a political neutrality policy I wrote. I hope this will help the library avoid political entanglements and bias for many years to come, long after I leave.

On April 6th, I met with the Princeton Historical Society board and we decided to collaborate on some events for Princeton's 175th Anniversary:

Princeton History: Go Big AND Go Home!

During the whole month of July, the Historical Society will have large photo and artifact exhibits at the Folklore Museum and the Princeton Public Library showcasing over 175 years of our city's history. Each room or area in the building(s) will represent a different decade or subject, and huge photo enlargements will ensure that nobody misses a single detail.

Collecting & Sharing Your Stories

We are inviting longtime Princeton residents to sit down and have conversations together which will be recorded for posterity. These conversations with be guided by prompts and artifacts from our city's history. Four of these events will take place at the library: June 8, July 13, August 10, and September 14, 3-5pm.

On April 7th, I went to Mr. Mosloff's home and loaded up several boxes of donations for our book sale.

On April 8th, we were closed for Easter.

On April 10th, I spoke to the Rosendale Historical Society about our digitization project, encouraged them to use library system resources, and answered technical questions.

On April 11th, the Green Lake County librarians met to prepare for our County Reads program on the 15th. We also discussed county funding formulas, city funding, and Berlin library's 120th anniversary celebration.

In maintenance news:

We received two quotes to replace the front doors, which we will discuss at our next Library Board meeting. I washed the building's outside front windows and started cleaning up the backyard.

We had a staff meeting at 8am on Friday April 14th to review old and new policies and procedures. We also had a quiz, talked about scheduling, and I assigned some duties for the coming weeks.

Morgan Martinez Green Lake County 4-H Program Educator April 2023

This report briefly describes the work that was completed within the 4-H Program in April 2023.

Program Highlights

4-H Leaders' Association

Organized at the county level, the 4-H Leaders' Association works closely with the 4-H Program Educator. The group brings together volunteers to serve as a venue for volunteer leader training and an organizing mechanism in providing volunteer and financial support for county level educational opportunities for 4-H members and 4-H volunteers. At their April 13, 2023 meeting I provided education on the topics of 4-H summer camp and upcoming 4-H educational county and state opportunities.

4-H Super Saturday Workshops

Green Lake County 4-H Super Saturday was held on Saturday, April 22, 2023 at the Green Lake County Government Center. Super Saturday gives 4-H members the opportunity to participate in hands-on learning through sessions taught by 4-H members, 4-H leaders, and community volunteers. Topics range from painting to electricity to gardening. Over 30 4-H members participated in this project-based day of learning.

I lead a session on duct tape projects where 18 youth learned the new skill of how to make projects using only duct tape, explored their sense of creativity, and shared their ideas with others.

I also lead a session on paper circuits where 8 youth explored electrical circuits that powered an LED to create a light up greeting card.







4-H Candy Company Workshop

On April 25, 2023 I led a Candy Company Workshop at the Green Lake County Government Center Seven 4-H youth in grades 2 through grade 5 participated in this workshop. I facilitated instruction in exploring Food Science. The evening started off learning about the importance of food safety before heading into the kitchen. In the kitchen, youth worked together in small groups to follow a lollipop recipe and learned beginner techniques of candy making. Together

as a large group, the young people were encouraged to explore their creative and artistic skills as they practiced working together as a team and communicating in a group setting to name their company, create a company logo and name their flavors of lollipops.

National Volunteer Appreciation Week

National Volunteer Appreciation Week was April 16-22, 2023. During this week I mailed over 60 handwritten thank you cards to enrolled 4-H volunteers recognizing their volunteer efforts and thanking them for the positive impact they have on Green Lake County 4-H. A "Proud Green Lake County 4-H" sticker was included as a token of appreciation.

For this week I also put out a request to 4-H members for submissions thanking and recognizing 4-H volunteers that have made an impact on them. Without the incredible 4-H volunteers, Green Lake County 4-H program would not be the same!

April Report for the May 9, 2023 meeting

2023 Fair

- Judges waiting on two judges' agreements, otherwise all judges have been hired.
- Received a couple new Food Truck/Stand contracts from:
 - Smokehouse Barbeque from Plainfield
 - > Green Lake County 4-H Leaders' Association will have a slushie stand instead of Bingo
- BestWay Driving Academy, owners Mike & Sheila Pulice, along with Green Lake Service Center owner Greg Woyak, are hoping to have a vehicle at the fair and educate fairgoers how to change a tire and discuss any other automobile basics. They will be taking the double space that was previously occupied by the Sheriff's Department.
- Commercial Space contracts continue to come in.
- Country Clovers 4-H Club will again be having their Pancake Breakfast on Friday morning.
- All Fair Superintendents have been contacted. Since a couple of departments had retiring superintendents, I searched for some new ones to fill those spots. Beth Howman-Combs will be a new superintendent for Small Animal/Vet Science and Natural Resources and Beth Lind will be a new superintendent for the Foods Department.
- Fair Partnership Sponsor donations received \$12,925.00 to date from 56 businesses. Of those 56, are 21 new businesses supporting the Fair.
- The Goat Superintendents were very helpful in sending me the information for the new addition of Meat and Market Goats for the Fair Book. We worked together until it was all fine tuned and ready for print.
- On Sunday, April 30, the Green Lake County Fairest of the Fair Coronation was held at the Government Center, Training Room. This event was coordinated in collaboration with the Fairest Coordinator, Emily Strahota. We had two applicants for Fairest and one for the Jr. Fairest. The afternoon began with interviews held in the Extension Conference room. We were very thankful for our three judges who took time out of their schedule on a Sunday afternoon.
