HIGHWAY COMMITTEE MEETING May 10, 2023

The meeting of the Highway Committee was called to order by Chair Dennis Mulder at 3:00 PM on Wednesday, May 10, 2023, in the County Board Room, Green Lake County Government Center, Green Lake, WI. The meeting was held both in person and via Microsoft Teams. The requirements of the open meeting law were certified as being met. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES 03/08/23 and 04/12/23

Motion/second (Buss/Boutwell) to approve the minutes of 03/08/23 and the Special Highway/Judicial Law minutes of 04/12/23. Motion carried with no negative vote.

PUBLIC COMMENT – None

Discussion on Automatic License Plate Reading Cameras in the County Right of Way

Sherriff Podoll explained the use of the cameras would be for helping apprehend wanted or suspected persons using license plate recognition software on a statewide network database. The company Flock Safety has been contracted by the sheriff's department to install the cameras on breakaway poles along the county roadways in specific locations. Podoll explained that once the camera systems are up and installed, they are the property of the sheriff's department, and the highway department has no financial obligation to them if they were to be damaged in any way.

Motion/second (Schweder/Buss) to support the use of the License Plate Reading Cameras in the County Road Right of Way. Motion Carried with no negative vote.

Discussion on New Hire for Additional Town of Mackford Plow Route

Commissioner Mashuda explained what is needed as a minimum for Highway to take on another winter maintenance route for the Town of Mackford, which includes guaranteed summer maintenance work to hire additional help. Administrator Wylie noted that a request for contingency funds would be needed as money is not currently budgeted for in 2023 but will be budgeted for in 2024.

Discussion on Future Highway Facility

Supervisor Mulder explained a new highway facility is definite need. An Ad Hoc Committee is needed to explore all the options regarding the facility and location. Administrator Wylie is in favor of a new facility and indicated now is the time to start the process.

Resolution To Authorize the Creation Of An Ad Hoc Committee To Explore The Creation Of A New Highway Department Facility

Motion/second (Schweder/Boutwell) to approve the Resolution to Authorize the Creation of an Ad Hoc Committee to Explore the Creation of a New Highway Department Facility and forward to County Board for approval. Motion Carried with no negative vote.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN GREEN LAKE COUNTY AND

THE VILLAGE OF MARQUETTE FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF CTH H

This Agreement is made by and between Green Lake County, with its principal place of business and county seat located at 571 County Road A, Green Lake, WI, hereinafter ("County") and the Village of Marquette with its principal place of business located at 127 E 4th Street, Marquette, WI 53947, hereinafter ("Village"), both of which are municipal corporations in the State of Wisconsin.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the County is planning for the reconstruction of CTH H in construction year 2025, of approximately 2.64 miles of rural cross section and urban cross section to current standards as part of Trans 205; and,

WHEREAS, the Project will include various road and infrastructure improvements that will be funded by the County and the Village; and,

WHEREAS, the improvements are in the public interest and further the public purpose of providing an efficient transportation network.

WHEREAS, the County and the Village agree to enter into this mutually beneficial agreement to construct and maintain improvements and other items current with and under the same contracts as the Project; and,

WHEREAS, Wisconsin law encourages and authorizes inter-governmental agreements. Sec. 66.0301, Wis. Stats.

Now, in consideration of the promises and covenants herein contained and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. Project and estimated costs.

a. The project consists of reconstruction of approximately 2.64 miles of CTH H from Puckaway Rd. to CTH KK/B in Green Lake County.

Approximately 0.47 miles will be an urban cross section consisting of two (2) 11-foot lanes, one side of reject Type A & D curb, and the opposite side a 2 ft shoulder. The remaining 2.17 miles will consist of a rural cross

- section to current standards meeting Trans 205, two (2) 11-foot lanes with 2 ft shoulders on each lane.
- b. The County agrees to reconstruct the portion of CTH H through the Village of Marquette with the Village paying for the curb and gutter system to fix the drainage next to the roadway as to prevent damage to the new roadway surface and underlying subgrade.
- c. The Village will pay the County Highway Department a one-time, lump sum of \$75,000 to cover the costs of a curb and gutter system to provide proper drainage, avoid making the ditches unmowable and maintain aesthetics throughout the Village.
- d. The Village agrees to allow the County to fill excess material in the Village's road right-of-way as to prevent hauling costs to the County and to provide uniform, safe road slopes to the Village.
- e. The County highway department will manage the project, bidding, and subcontractors, as well as preform all grading, base, and pavement work.
- f. The county highway commissioner shall have the final say on all project related activities.
- g. Project estimate attached.
- 2. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. The County and Village will each save and hold each other harmless from any and all liability, claims, damages and expenses that may result from either party's intentional or negligent wrongdoing during the construction of these improvements. Notwithstanding the foregoing, neither party waives Wis. Stat. 893.80 or any other liability limiting statute.
- 3. <u>Assignment</u>. No party may assign its rights under this Agreement or any of its rights or duties without the written consent of the other party.
- 4. <u>Approval</u>. Each party has read the Agreement and certifies that the official executing the Agreement has lawful authority and formal approval to bind that party.
- 5. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall become effective on the latest date of execution. All terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefits of the legal representative, successors and executors. No rights under this Agreement may be transferred to a third party. This Agreement creates no third-party enforcement rights.
- 6. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This instrument contains the entire agreement between the parties, and no statements, promises, or inducements made by any party or agent of any party that are not contained in this written Agreement shall be valid or binding.

- 7. <u>Modification</u>. This Agreement may not be enlarged, modified, or altered unless it is in writing and signed by each party after formal approval thereof.
- 8. <u>Prohibition on Discrimination</u>. All parties will specifically comply with all state, federal, and local laws prohibiting discrimination by reason of age, race, color, religion, handicap, sex, physical condition, developmental disability as defined in s. 51.01(5), sexual orientation, and national origin.
- 9. <u>Compliance</u>. Each party shall abide in all respects with state, federal, and local laws, rules and regulations which concern the construction and improvement of roadways.
- 10. <u>Intergovernmental Agreement</u>. This Agreement is an official intergovernmental contract authorized under s. 66.0301, Wis. Stats.
- 11. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
- 12. Each party has participated in negotiating and drafting this Agreement, so if an ambiguity or a question of intent or interpretation arises, this Agreement is to be construed as if the Parties had drafted it jointly, as opposed to being construed against a Party because it was responsible for drafting one or more provisions of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>Severability</u>. If any term of this Agreement is to any extent illegal, otherwise invalid, or incapable of being enforced, such term shall be excluded to the extent of such invalidity or unenforceability; all other terms hereof shall remain in full force and effect; and, to the extent permitted and possible, the invalid or unenforceable term shall be deemed replaced by a term that is valid and enforceable and that comes closest to expressing the intention of such invalid or unenforceable term.
- 14. <u>Notices</u>. All notices, demands, certificates or other communications under this Agreement shall be sufficiently given and shall be deemed given when hand delivered or emailed to the heads of each government.
- 15. The Project is contingent on the Village and County's ability to fully fund their respective portion of the project. If the funds are not available to either party for the completion of the project, that party shall provide written notice to the other by the end of the calendar year 2024 resulting in contract/project termination.
- 16. If the Village withdraws from the Project, it will reimburse the County for any costs incurred on behalf of the Project.
