APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion/second (**Hoffmann/Hiestand**) to approve the minutes of the June 13, 2023 and June 27, 2023 meetings as presented. Motion carried with no negative vote.

COUNTY LIBRARY SERVICES REPORT

Laura Skalitsky, Director of the Princeton Public Library, spoke on the various summer reading programs throughout the county along with other community enrichment options provided to youth and adults.

2024 COUNTY LIBRARY BUDGET

County Administrator Cate Wylie stated that she met recently with the WinneFox Library System to discuss and better understand the library funding. Budget numbers for 2024 will be provided soon.

Corporation Counsel Jeff Mann informed the committee regarding revisions made to the alcohol concession agreement. He also defined the consumption area versus the service area. County Administrator Cate Wylie led a discussion in regard to continuing the alcohol sales. *Motion/second (Hoffmann/Hiestand)* to continue fermented malt beverage sales at the fair. Motion carried with no negative vote.

FAIR: 2023 FAIR TEMPORARY SERVICES AGREEMENT – DISCUSSION/APPROVAL

FAIR: HIGHWAY GROUND/FAIRGROUND IMPROVEMENTS

County Administrator Cate Wylie stated that there are discrepancies in the 2023 budget in regard to \$34,850 carried over from 2020 due to cancellation of the Fair. Resolution 18-2022 was postponed indefinitely so the approval to carry over the funds was not done. Discussion held. No action taken at this time.



This is a fantastic response to the program! Our goal is to encourage literacy after school is out, so kids don't lose their reading skills before the new year starts. Adults love to join in too.

I would like to share a cute story about a family participating in the Summer Reading Program. A 6-year-old was completing a reading card and turned to his mom and said, "Mom, you should read a book this summer too. Then you can win a prize and be smart just like me." This made me chuckle, as the mom turned to me and asked for an adult reading card also. We love the enthusiasm our patrons show towards reading!

During the month of August, we are offering a Bonus Reading Program to continue the goal of getting books in everyone's hands. The prizes for August are being sponsored by Friends of the Berlin Library and are gift certificates for all local businesses. We like to encourage shopping/eating local when we can. They are always so generous to the library, so we are returning the favor.

This week on Wednesday, we are partnering with Berlin Park & Rec for a program titled, Take Flight. Kids can sign up for this free program and come learn to make various types of things that fly. Thanks to our Friends, this program will be free with lunch provided.

Adult can sign up for craft night on August 22 to learn how to make Fairy Journals. And anyone 16 & over is invited to join us for an after-hours Game Night on August 25.
