The service area extends from Kansas City up to Rice Lake so when a breakage occurs it can be anywhere in that area which then affects all subscribers. Green Lake County is moving to a new network which is web designed but a cutover date has not been confirmed at this point. The equipment has been installed so Green Lake County is just waiting on an installation date.


