Town of Kingston had 54 voters.

Town of Mackford had 26 voters.

Town of Manchester had 49 voters.

Town of Marquette had 24 voters.

Town of Princeton had 143 voters.

Town of St. Marie had 39 voters.

Town of Seneca had 38 voters. A few voters did not sign the poll books, so the election works had to track them down and have them come back and sign.

Village of Kingston had 22 voters.

Village of Marguette had 18 voters.

City of Berlin had 212 voters but 1 over voter so the total is 211 voters.

City of Green Lake had 97 voters.

City of Markesan had 88 voters.

City of Princeton had 87 voters.
